# Budget Justification Page

- A SENIOR PERSONNEL: The PI is requesting 1 month support: **\$9,246**, plus 4% increase each year.
- **B** OTHER PERSONNEL:
  - 1. The PI is requesting six quarters per year of graduate student support at \$2,124/month salary per student with an increase of 4% each year.

#### C FRINGE BENEFITS:

- 1. Fringe benefits for the PI's salary will be 23.8% each year.
- 2. Fringe benefits for graduate students will be 13.4% each year.

#### D EQUIPMENT:

- E TRAVEL:
  - 1. Awardees Meeting: Travel for all students to annual awardees meeting: \$1,000/each for 8 students.
  - 2. Conferences: Travel for each student to one conference during the year: \$1,000/each for 8 students.
  - 3. Visitors: Support for faculty mentor visitors who will work on SAGE and mentoring undergraduates: 4,000/each for 4 month-long visitor per year. (\$500 travel, \$500 food,  $30 \times 100$ /day for hotel).

### F OTHER DIRECT COSTS:

- 1. Student Stipends: The PI is requesting stipends for 8 undergraduate participants at a rate of \$6,625/year. This is \$53,000/year plus a 4% increase each year.
- 2. Material and Supplies:
  - Money for software and books that will be needed by students for their projects. \$3600/year. 12 people (8 students, the PI, and 3 graduate students) at \$300/each.
  - Portable computers: \$13200/year for 11 laptops that will be used by the students to create a portable lab environment, for interactive presentations of project results, for workshop "coding sprints", and for development of software and databases. The computers are \$1200/each, and would revert to the SAGE project.
- G INDIRECT COSTS: Facilities and Administrative costs will be reimbursed at less than the University of Washington's current Indirect Cost Rate negotiated with DHHS on 7/15/05. An administrative allowance, limited to 25% of the participant support stipend amount (Line F.1 on the proposal budget) is allowed for CSUMS awards as partial reimbursement of indirect costs, per the proposal guidelines at http://www.nsf.gov/pubs/2006/nsf06559/nsf06559.pdf/.
